

Upper School eLearning Information & Tips

As we move into the next two weeks of an eLearning platform, the Administration would like to share some information in order to keep our Middle and High School students on track.

-Students will have approximately 30 minutes of work per class per day, including electives. This means your students should have approximately **210 minutes or 3.5 hours of work per day.**

-A set schedule (with a firm start and end time) is highly recommended to keep your students on track. During this scheduled time, make sure all TV, video games, and phones are turned off.

-AP students should expect additional minutes for their classes as they continue to prepare for the AP Exam Season.

-Teachers will use Google Classroom as the main platform for assigning and submitting assignments; there are a plethora of different platforms available as supplements. Teachers may also use some of these platforms.

-Detailed lesson plans will be entered into RenWeb1 for parents to view.

-Each assignment will have a firm deadline. Students cannot wait to complete all work at the end of our two week closure. All assignments and deadlines must be treated the same as if the students were in classes.

-Students should log in to Google Classroom each day to see their assignments. Teachers will post links and assignments daily. There is not a specific time that students should log on. They should be checking each day and turning in assignments by their stated deadlines.

-Teachers will continue to grade and provide feedback throughout the next two weeks. Grades will be entered into RenWeb.

-Students should refer to the honor code and complete assignments individually unless otherwise indicated by the teacher.

-Sticking to these criteria will allow your student to continue to earn credit for this

year; it should allow us to continue to stick to our school calendar with a normal end date of school.

-Electives will look a little bit different because of the nature of eLearning. Teachers will be sending creative ways to meet their class requirements.

-If your student is enrolled in our LD Program, you will receive additional communication from Ms. Erwin.

-Teachers will be available via email should you have any questions over the next two weeks.
